The new school library is open!

The children have returned after Easter to our completed whole school library. The library contains over 2,300 brand new books costing over £12,000. It now contains both Fiction and Non-Fiction books. Sections include; Picture Books, Fiction for Lower Phase, Fiction for Upper Phase, Graphic Novels and Dual Language. The Non-Fiction books are arranged into categories according to the Dewey colour system. There really is something for everyone! The new seating area looks comfy too! The library will be used by each class during the school day and by the Book Clubs run during lunchtime. Children will be able to choose books to read during their 'Reading For Pleasure' time that they have each day in school. The mantra for our new library is 'Every book is worth reading' and we certainly think that they are!

Thank you to those that are supporting our 'One Way System' at home time. It helps for a smoother and safer pick up time for us all.




